

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES AT FLYING HORSE FARMS

Thank you for your interest in volunteering for a camp session at Flying Horse Farms! It's camps goal for every camper, volunteer, guest, and staff member to have the opportunity for a transformational experience, so mark your calendars, pack your bags, and get ready for the best weekend of your year!

Camp Sessions

Camp sessions take place throughout the spring, summer, and fall. Our full schedule can be found online, and includes spring and fall family camp weekends, summer residential camps, and an adolescent/young adult weekend program.

Volunteer orientation takes place before each session. Training sessions include camps mission, values, and philosophy; medical and psychosocial care; role and schedule overview; facilitation and challenge by choice; servant leadership; camp safety orientation, and trauma informed care.

Volunteer Roles

Family Sidekick: As a Family Sidekick you will be placed with a camper family to act as their weekend guide to facilitate fun. You will oscillate between spending time with the whole family to providing supervision for campers when caregivers break off to kick-back and relax. If you want to build a deeper connection with a single family and experience all of camp, this is the experience for you!

Activity Team: As an Activity Volunteer you will be responsible for facilitating all activities at your assigned program area and will support the full group program. From the waterfront to arts & crafts, you will keep camp humming. This experience is for you if you're interested in sinking into a single program area with the opportunity to spend time with every camper and family.

Cabin Counselor: As a Cabin Counselors you will be responsible for the direct supervision of a cabin group of 6-12 campers. Cabin Counselors provide basic behavioral and psycho-social support, relay basic medical needs to the cabin nurse, program daily cabin activities and support full group programming as needed.

Food Service: As a Kitchen Crew team member, you will support our chef in preparing food for all campers, families, and staff. This includes meeting all special dietary needs. You will also ensure the dining hall remains clean by setting up meal service, staffing the Dirty Dish Depot, and cleaning after meals.

Lifeguards: As a Lifeguard you will work lakeside or poolside any time water activities are open. Lifeguards must be at least 16 years old and must provide proof of current lifeguard certification and current CPR for the Professional Rescuer with AED certification.

Paperwork Requirements

FHF follows compliance measures set by the SeriousFun Children's Network, American Camp Association, and the State of Ohio to mitigate risk and put Campers First, always. To work directly with campers and receive the greatest impact, FHF requires the following information for all staff and volunteers.

Requirements:

- Online Application & References on File
- Brief Volunteer Phone Interview
- Background Check
- Medical Forms
 - 2023 Vaccine and Health History Attestation
 - COVID-19 Vaccine Series and Booster (if eligible)
 - Tetanus and Pertussis Vaccine (DTaP or TDaP; a booster within the last 10 years is required)
 - Basic Health History
 - Flu Vaccine (select fall camps)
