IU Health Arnett Hospital: Child Life Practicum

Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in IU Health Arnett Hospital's Child Life Practicum. Our team seeks a highly motivated student who is interested in furthering their knowledge of the field of child life. Upon completion of this practicum, students will have gained a basic understanding of the role of a child life specialist through experiences in the emergency department and pediatric unit, along with additional experiences in other clinical areas.

About IU Health Arnett Child Life Services:

- The child life program was established in 2018
- IU Health Arnett Hospital is a regional adult hospital that has pediatric services within it (i.e. a small pediatric med/surg unit, a Level III NICU, pediatric outpatient surgery, and is a Level III Emergency Department for trauma, etc.)
- Certified Child Life Specialists provide support to patients and families throughout the hospital, including pediatrics, emergency department, adult ICU, labor and delivery, NICU, outpatient surgery, outpatient lab, and adult med/surg.

Goals and Objectives:

- To gain a basic understanding of the role of a child life specialist
- To understand the impact of hospitalization and illness based on a child's developmental level
- To gain knowledge about medical terminology, procedures, and medical personnel
- To identify how a child life specialist is a member of the interdisciplinary team
- To gain further knowledge of how child development theory relates to child life interventions
- To increase understanding of working with hospitalized children (safety, appropriate toys, etc.)

Practicum Requirements:

- Completes written assignments on time
- Demonstrates ability to observe and reflect on interactions with patients and families
- Maintains HIPAA regulations and upholds hospital policies
- Maintains a positive and professional attitude
- Reports to scheduled shifts on time (schedule will be determined upon acceptance to practicum)

Application Requirements:

- Must be actively enrolled in an academic program, specifically geared towards a career as a child life specialist (child life, child development, or related field with a strong emphasis in child development).
 - Must have at least a 3.0 GPA
- Have a minimum of 50-hours of volunteer experience working with children in he
- Able to commit to an 8 or 12-week practicum, one or two shifts per week
- Able to pass a mandatory health screening, provide up-to-date vaccinations, and adhere to the hospital's confidentiality agreement and release of liability

Application Process:

Interested applicants who meet all requirements may submit an application to the child life team for review. A complete application must include the following:

- Resume and cover letter
- Current college transcript, including current GPA (unofficial transcripts accepted)
- Two professional letters of recommendation
- Verification of completion of at least 50 hours with children in stressful situations
- Typed responses to the following questions:
 - 1. How did you become interested in the child life profession?
 - 2. What do you expect to gain from this child life practicum?
 - 3. What have you done to increase your knowledge and awareness of the profession?
 - 4. What other commitments would you have during this practicum (work, school, etc.)?
